- *The Vendor will be responsible for all costs and charges such as shipping, transportation, custom clearances, any demurage charges happening, ect until the above mentioned final destination.*

II- SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS:

- Prospective vendor must guarantee that all of the offered items are new “New ONLY”, must be in original packaging, never used, and not altered in any way. All components must be manufacturer-approved and may not be compatible, remanufactured “not factory refurbished”.
- Quotation shall be provided with the detailed technical specifications and including product brochure or catalog.
- Quotation shall be provided with ETA delivery and warranty terms and delivery inspection.
- The vendor has an option to provide quoted prices that are all-inclusive and include Cost, Insurance and Freight (CIF), and transportation to the U.S Embassy, Phnom Penh without Customs Duty, Tax, and VAT. The Embassy will issue Diplomatic Note – Tax Exemption letter to facilitate the clearance of the

cargo with duty free but the Vendor MUST be responsible for all costs occurring for custom clearance processes, transportation, any demurrage charge, etc. until the complete delivery of vehicle at the bellow final destination after receiving the Diplomatic Note from the U.S Embassy Phnom Penh. Therefore, the price proposal should be inclusive all costs.

Delivery Terms:

- Delivery term is Door-to-Door, at the final destination of U.S Embassy Phnom Penh premise, address #1, St. 96, S/K Wat Phnom, Khan Daun Penh, Phnom Penh, Cambodia, with Certificate of Origin (Title).
- The ordered vehicle shall be delivered to the above destination within 1-2 months after issuing order.
- **The Vendor will be responsible for all costs and charges such as shipping, transportation, custom clearances, any demurrage charges, ect until the above mentioned final destination.**

III- LATE DELIVERY AND PENALTY

In case that the Vendor fails to make delivery on time as stipulated in the Contract, with the exception of Force Majeure causes (Earthquake, flood, hurricane, typhoon, explosion, etc), the Embassy has the right to penalize the Vendor. This applies in case the delay of shipment is more than one week. The penalty, however, shall not exceed 5% of the goods involved in the late delivery. The penalty rate is charged at 0.5% for every seven days starting counting from 8th day of the delay, odd days less than seven days should be counted as seven days.

The Offeror shall not complete the representation in paragraph (d)(2) of this provision if the Offeror has represented that it “does not use covered telecommunications equipment or services, or any equipment, system, or service that uses covered telecommunications equipment or services” in paragraph (c)(2) of the provision at 52.204–26, or in paragraph (v)(2)(ii) of the provision at 52.212–3.

This prohibition applies to the use of covered telecommunications equipment or services, regardless of whether that use is in performance of work under a Federal contract. (1)It will, will not provide covered telecommunications equipment or services to the Government in the performance of any contract, subcontract or other contractual instrument resulting from this solicitation. The Offeror shall provide the additional disclosure information required at paragraph (e)(1) of this section if the Offeror responds “will” in paragraph (d)(1) of this section; and

(2)After conducting a reasonable inquiry, for purposes of this representation, the Offeror represents that—

It does, does not use covered telecommunications equipment or services, or use any equipment, system, or service that uses covered telecommunications equipment or services. The Offeror shall provide the additional disclosure information required at paragraph (e)(2) of this section if the Offeror responds “does” in paragraph (d)(2) of this section.

(e) *Disclosures.*

(1) Disclosure for the representation in paragraph (d)(1) of this provision. If the Offeror has responded “will” in the representation in paragraph (d)(1) of this provision, the Offeror shall provide the following information as part of the offer:

(i)For covered equipment—

(C)Explanation of the proposed use of covered telecommunications equipment and any factors relevant to determining if such use would be permissible under the prohibition in paragraph (b)(1) of this provision.

(ii)For covered services—

(A)If the service is related to item maintenance: A description of all covered telecommunications services offered (include on the item being maintained: Brand; model number, such as OEM number, manufacturer part number, or wholesaler number; and item description, as applicable); or

(B) If not associated with maintenance, the Product Service Code (PSC) of the service being provided; and explanation of the proposed use of covered telecommunications services and any factors relevant to determining if such use would be permissible under the prohibition in paragraph (b)(1) of this provision.

(2) Disclosure for the representation in paragraph (d)(2) of this provision. If the Offeror has responded “does” in the representation in paragraph (d)(2) of this provision, the Offeror shall provide the following information as part of the offer:

(i) For covered equipment—

(A) The entity that produced the covered telecommunications equipment (include entity name, unique entity identifier, CAGE code, and whether the entity was the OEM or a distributor, if known);

(B) A description of all covered telecommunications equipment offered (include brand; model number, such as OEM number, manufacturer part number, or wholesaler number; and item description, as applicable); and

(C) Explanation of the proposed use of covered telecommunications equipment and any factors relevant to determining if such use would be permissible under the prohibition in paragraph (b)(2) of this provision.

(ii) For covered services—

(A) If the service is related to item maintenance: A description of all covered telecommunications services offered (include on the item being maintained: Brand; model number, such as OEM number, manufacturer part number, or wholesaler number; and item description, as applicable); or

(B) If not associated with maintenance, the PSC of the service being provided; and explanation of the proposed use of covered telecommunications services and any factors relevant to determining if such use would be permissible under the prohibition in paragraph (b)(2) of this provision.
